## **Improving boat berths**





Work has begun on increasing the number of tie down berths and several work parties have taken place during this month. Around 20 people turned out to help move boats (80+) from the western boundary fence on the weekend 22nd/23<sup>rd</sup> Sept and , moved about 20 unidentified or abandoned boats to the NW corner, clear a load of undergrowth from around the lake, pressure washed and restained the picnic tables, pressure wash the path in front of the club, removed old masts and other items (including boats and windsurfers) that were tied to the fence (the fence has just been repaired, so any future attachments will be removed and the members responsible can expect to be chastised). In addition a scrap metal merchant is due to remove the old steel garage from in front of the training room and any scrap metal items therein.

A clear up of the lake area is long overdue, so all boats, kayaks, windsurfers, trolleys, trailers or anything else on site that cannot be identified, preferably by a current membership sticker will be assumed to have been abandoned and will be relocated to a quarantine area at the NW corner of the lake. Spaces vacated by removal of these items will be reallocated.

#### Outstanding jobs to be completed:

Repair and relocate number 1 and number 3 racing marks; Lay concrete base for the new storeroom; Construct new store room; Complete painting of changing rooms; Further clearance of undergrowth;

Grass cutting; Remove and redesign work bench in garage; Tidy garage store; Lay concrete path around garage; Install retaining posts for garage doors; Maintenance to Club training boats (Wanderers); Clear Southern boundary fence of undergrowth and abandoned craft.
